Communication from Dr. Catherine Latham, Superintendent of Schools:

Dear Council President:

This letter is in response to your request dated May 29, 2013. On June 13, 2013, the Lynn School Committee voted unanimously to send a letter of endorsement to the City Council to support a public vote on September 17, 2013, on the bond needed to support the Marshall Middle School project. I ask that the City Council take action to allow the required bond question to be included on the September 17, 2013 ballot. The wording for that question has been approved by both the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) and Lynn Attorney James Lamanna and is included in this request.

The current Marshall Middle school is not large enough to house its in-district students and support their academic and extra-curricular needs. As part of the MSBA process, Lynn completed a Feasibility Study approved and accepted by the MSBA. The conclusion of that study was that the only viable option for Marshall was replacement as opposed to repair. To that end the MSBA has allowed Lynn to go forward with plans for a new school with a project reimbursement rate of 80% of allowable costs.

This building project is vitally important for the long term well-being of the school system. Without approval, Marshall will be removed from the MSBA building project list; Lynn will no longer be eligible for any future projects; and Lynn will need to repair Marshall and maintain the building for the foreseeable future while absorbing 100% of the cost.

The Lynn Public School Department has seen increased enrollment of nearly 900 students over the past five years. By the time our current kindergarten, grade 1 and grade 2 students are in grades 6, 7 and 8, there will be 1,000 more students than currently in those grades today, and there will be inadequate space to educate those students. We need to increase student capacity and improve student programs. A new Marshall Middle School will put Lynn on track for improving the schools and the city.

IN CITY COUNCIL

A BOND ORDER TO PAY COSTS OF CONSTRUCTING, ORIGINALLY EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING A NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL.

BE IT ORDERED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNN AS FOLLOWS:

That the City appropriates the amount of Ninety-Two Million Dollars (\$92,000,000) for the purpose of paying costs of constructing, originally equipping and furnishing a new

Thurgood Marshall Middle School, to be located at (92-118-120 Brookline Street Address) in Lynn, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto (the "Project"), which school facility shall have an anticipated useful life as an educational facility for the instruction of school children for a least 50 years, and for which the City may be eligible for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority ("MSBA"), said amount to be expended at the direction of the School Building Committee.

To meet this appropriation the City Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor, is hereby authorized to borrow the sum of Ninety Two Million Dollars (\$92,000,000) under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7, Clause (3) of the General Laws, as amended and supplemented, or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefor. The City acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA and any Project costs the City incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA on account of the Project shall not exceed the lesser of (i) eighty percent (80%) of eligible approved Project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (ii) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA; and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement relating to the Project that may be executed between the City of the MSBA

FURTHER ORDERED: That the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "Commonwealth") to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City authorized by this Order, and to provide such information and execute such documents as such officials of the Commonwealth may require in connection therewith.

Ordered that the following question be submitted to the voters of the City of Lynn at the Preliminary Election to be held on Tuesday, September 17, 2013, pursuant to the Lynn City Charter:

QUESTION:

"Shall the vote of the Lynn City Council dated August 13, 2013 wherein it was voted to approve the borrowing of the sum of ninety-two million (\$92,000,000.00) for the purpose of the design, construction and completion of a new Thurgood Marshall Middle School at 92 and 118-120 Brookline Street in Lynn, be approved contingent upon 80% State Reimbursement for eligible costs as approved by the Massachusetts School Building Authority?"
