

**NOTIFICATION OF AQUATIC TREATMENT
CITY OF LYNN, MASSACHUSETTS**



FLAX POND AND SLUICE POND

Portions of Flax Pond and Sluice Pond in Lynn, Massachusetts will be chemically treated with USEPA/MA registered herbicides/algaecides to control nuisance aquatic vegetation and algae on **Wednesday, June 20, 2018 beginning at 9AM.**

Following treatment, both ponds will be closed to all water uses, (including swimming, fishing and boating) until **Thursday, June 21, 2018.** Use of the water from both ponds for drinking/cooking, irrigation and watering livestock (i.e. cattle, horses) is prohibited for 5 days commencing on the day of treatment.

Additionally, for Sluice Pond, water from the following two cove areas should not be used for irrigation for a period of 90 days following treatment:

- 1) Northwest cove bordered by Jenness Street to the east, Kernwood Drive to the west and Sutcliff Road to the north
- 2) Northeast cove bordered by Jenness Street to the west and north and by Savory/Newbern Roads to the east

Additional "booster" treatments may be performed in these two areas during June, July and August.

The treatment is being performed by Aquatic Control Technology, Inc., of Sutton, MA under contract to the City of Lynn, and pursuant to a permit (license) issued by MA DEP (Flax 38-319, Sluice 38-310) and an Order of Condition issued by the Lynn Conservation Commission.

SLUICE POND

Portions of Sluice Pond in Lynn, Massachusetts will be chemically treated with USEPA/MA registered herbicides/algaecides to control nuisance aquatic vegetation and algae on **Wednesday, June 20, 2018 beginning at 9:00 AM.**

Following treatment, the pond will be closed to all water uses, (including swimming, fishing and boating) until **Thursday, June 21, 2018.** Use of the water from the pond for drinking/cooking, irrigation and watering livestock (i.e. cattle, horses) is prohibited for 5 days commencing on the day of treatment.

Additionally, for Sluice Pond, water from the following two cove areas should not be used for irrigation for a period of 90 days following treatment:

- 1) Northwest cove bordered by Jenness Street to the east, Kernwood Drive to the west and Sutcliff Road to the north,
- 2) Northeast cove bordered by Jenness Street to the west and north and by Savory/Newbern Roads to the east.

Additional "booster" treatments may be performed in these two areas during June, July and August.

The treatment is being performed by Solitude Lake Management, 590 Lane Street, Shrewsbury, MA 01545 under contract to the City of Lynn, and pursuant to a permit (license) issued by MA·BEP (Sluice 38-310) and an Order of Condition issued by the Lynn Conservation Commission.
