Alinsug/Proclamation Declaring July 2025 as Disability Pride Month

Proclamation Declaring July 2025 As Disability Pride Month

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Lynn, in City Council assembled, as follows:

WHEREAS, July marks Disability Pride Month, coinciding with the anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), enacted by the United States Congress on July 26, 1990, as a landmark civil rights law protecting millions of Americans from discrimination; and this month not only celebrates the passage of the ADA, but also honors the ongoing movement led by disabled people for civil rights, equality, and equity; additionally, it is an opportunity for all of us to increase visibility, promote inclusion and representation, uplift the lived experiences and contributions of the disability community, and deepen our understanding of disability as a natural part of human diversity;

WHEREAS, more than 1 in 4 adults (28.7 percent) in the United States have some type of disability, making up the largest and most diverse minority group within our nation's population, representing all abilities, ages, races, ethnicities, religions, and socio-economic backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, at some point in life, almost all individuals will experience disability; and

WHEREAS, Disability Pride empowers those with disabilities to define their own identity, breaks down stigma and stereotypes of those with disabilities, and serves as a tool to tackle the ableism that persists to this day; and

WHEREAS, Disability Civil Rights champions held the longest nonviolent federal building occupation in U.S. history—a 26-day sit-in in San Francisco—leading the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare (HEW) to issue regulations implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which were signed into law on April 28, 1977; and

WHEREAS, it is essential to promote a community that embraces disability as an integral and valued part of human diversity, where all individuals are treated with dignity, respect, and equality, and where barriers to participation and inclusion are eliminated; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lynn recognizes the importance of supporting all of our communities by having a Disability Commission which is to provide officials, employees and the public with assistance and guidance and to make recommendations to improve any issue within the City that may negatively impact people with disabilities. Making sure everything in the city is ADA compliant. While we know there is more work to be done, the City remains committed to building greater accessibility throughout the community; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Lynn proclaim July 2025 as Disability Pride Month. We encourage all residents to be a voice for the disability community, to advocate for greater inclusion, representation, and empowerment, and to stand united in support of civil rights, equality, and equity for all.


